# ELLEFSEN APPOINTED TO COMMISSION ON AGING.


John Ellefsen was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Commission on Aging. He will represent seniors from the Hayward area of Alameda County. John is secretary of the board of directors and a founding member of Lavender Seniors of East Bay.

John is a sixty-six year old gay man currently living in Hayward. He has lived in the East Bay area for 22 years. He retired about ten years ago, after twenty-one years as a social worker. He worked sixteen years with Alameda County Social Services. Most of those years he was a Child Welfare Worker.

John's interest in aging issues and needs started around the time he turned sixty. Primarily that interest has taken the form of being active with Lavender Seniors of the East Bay.

John attended the monthly meetings of the Advisory Commission as a visitor. He was impressed with the quality of work that both the Commissioners and the Aging Agency staff have been doing. He cites the spirit of friendly cooperation among all. When he learned there was a vacancy on the Advisory Commission from the supervisorial district serving Hayward, he decided to apply in hopes of serving better both the aging population in the county in general and his own community.

# INFORMATION ABOUT THE ALAMEDA COUNTY ADVISORY COMMISSION ON AGING by John Ellefsen

There are 21 appointed members. Each of the five County Supervisors appoints two; the Alameda County Mayors' Conference appoints four from the North County and four from the South County (8); plus three at-large appointments. The terms are four years long. A person can serve two terms. Each commissioner must serve on at least one committee in addition to attending the regular monthly meeting of the Commission. It usually meets on the second Monday of each month at 8000 Edgewater Drive in Oakland (near 880 and Hegenberger). The public is always welcome to attend the meetings and speak briefly on issues.

The primary committees Legislative, Public Relations, and Health and Safety (our own Donna Montgomery is on the Health and Safety Committee). You don't have to be on the Commission to work on that Committee. There are also three Commissioners who act as liaisons to other Committees: to the Alameda County Para-transit Committee; to the California Senior Legislature (which meets in Sacramento and is supported by public funds and donations (as on Line 49 of your State Income Tax form); and to the TACC, which stands for the Area Agencies on Aging California Council and includes all the Area Agencies on Aging in the state.

The officers of the Commission are elected annually by the Commission members. The Commission is advised and assisted in its work by staff from the Alameda County Area Agency on Aging,

> which is part of the Alameda County Social Services Agency. From my observations of the Committee and the staff, they have an excellent working relationship. The meetings of the Commission are business-like, but also friendly and with light-hearted moments as well

> After I go the through orientation for new Commissioners, I'll have a better idea of what the Commission does. Some of their work includes producing a bimonthly Senior Update newsletter. (The current issue has the article on Lavender Seniors and Collaborative

Project that I submitted to them); advising the Board of Supervisors on requests for funding of senior service programs; taking stands on various legislation proposals in Sacramento or Washington DC that affect seniors (this in done only in coordination with the Board of Supervisors and the lobbyists hired by the county); and keeping irif6rmed on all services and issues regarding seniors in the county and spreading information about those matters to whatever groups or senior service centers the Commissioners have contact with.

When I applied to be appointed on the Commission, because there was a vacancy in the supervisorial district that covers Hayward (Gail Steele is the current Supervisor), I emphasized my involvement with Lavender Seniors and the Collaborative Project, and said that I wanted to be on the Commission in hopes of serving both the general senior population and the gay and lesbian senior population.

#### **BOOK REVIEW**

#### Columbia Reader on Lesbians & Gay Men in Media, Society, and Politics

Edited by Larry Gross & James Woods Columbia University Press, paperback

How delicious it is to wallow joyously in a big fat paperback of over six hundred pages of the best gay reporting and thinking since the end of World War II.

These historic articles roam widely over time from a 1947 Newsweek article, "Homosexuals in Uniform," to Cardinal Ratzinger's "Letter to The Bishops of the Catholic Church on the Pastoral Care of Homosexual Persons." Larry Gross and James Woods, both Professors of Communications, have given us the satisfying gift of historical prospective and exposing us to little known research on gay pockets of complex human interest.

#### **CREATING CHANGE CONFERENCE IN OAKLAND**

Oakland and Bay Area activists are gearing up for the Twelfth Annual Creating Change Conference, the country's largest and most exciting annual gathering of the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender movement. Creating Change 1999 will take place at the Oakland Marriott City Center Hotel, November 10-14. The annual conference is expected to attract over 2200 activists and organizers from around the country.

This year's Creating Change Conference will be greatly influenced by its location in Oakland. Because California is preparing for the Knight Initiative vote in 2000, a special training entitled "Defeat Knight: Door-Knock in Your Community" will teach the electoral skill and the human art of door-to-door voter identification and persuasion.

The 1999 Conference is also supported by the Pacific Center for Human Growth of Berkeley, which will serve as the anchor organization for the Host Committee. In this capacity, the Pacific Center will assist the Host Committee by providing

a postal address, financial and accounting services, and additional outreach to the community.
