As I have told those of you whom I have met, I am thrilled to be at Lavender Seniors! I have had the chance to meet some of you and look forward to meeting many more of you in the days to come. 





PARTICULAR VOICES: PORTRAITS OF GAY & LESBIAN WRITERS EDITED BY ROBERT GIARD

hristopher Bram once wrote, "For years books were the only source of information and inspiration for closeted gays and lesbians." As we read lavender literature


we are often curious about the private lives of our sources of inspiration. What do they look like and how do they feel? Giard has compiled what may strike some writers as a scissors and paste job, taken from various sources such as *The Gay American History* by Jonathan Katz. Joan Nestle introduces the women's section via *I Wanted To Live Long Enough To Kiss A Woman: The* 



Life of Lesbian Literature and Christopher Bram takes us to the gay male perspective in Mapping The Territory: Gay Men's Writing.

Some of these literary folk declined to be included and others had passed away. The cream of the pink crop are represented here: Terrence McNally, Larry Kramer, Randy Shilts, John Boswell, Dorothy Allison, Adrienne Rich, Audre Lorde and countless others. I would question including Eleanor Roosevelt and Lorena Hickok. This is wishful thinking on the editor's part. There is no definitive proof of their sexuality.

are included in all policy resolutions and that program wording specifically recognizes the family structures we choose as LGBT people. To make our

mark, we must begin to act now. Held

as an official delegate, and Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi, D-Calif., appointed Lyon. With the help of the others, Martin and Lyon ensured that the term "sexual orientation" was included in several resolutions for the first time in the history of the WHCOA...."



The main principles of the 1995 WHCOA were to value the independence of older adults, to recognize the interdependence of older and younger people, and to ensure the quality of life of all Americans as they age...

every ten years, the WHCOA has served as a catalyst for aging policy since 1961. The first WHCOA provided the basis for what became the older Americans Act of 1965. That conference and the two that followed prompted the establishment of many of the key programs that represent America's aging policy today: Medicare and Medicaid (1961): the Supplemental Security Income program and the National Institute on Aging (1971); and Social Security reform, expansion of homecare coverage under Medicare, and the Older Americans Act (1981). A priority in the '95 WHCOA was its reaffirmation of the Older Americans Act. The main principles of the 1995 WHCOA were to value the independence of older adults, to recognize the interdependence of older and younger people, and to ensure the quality of life of all Americans as they age...."

Of the 2,217 delegates who attended the WHOCOA in 1995, only four or five were out LGBT people. Led by pioneering lesbian activists Phyllis Lyon and Del Martin, this small group worked toward having LGBT concerns recognized in at least one of the final resolutions of the conference. Senator Dianne Feinstein, D-Calif., appointed Martin

The article goes on to discuss what we should do organizationally to achieve aggressive goals for the WHCOA. Yes, California was in the lead in 1995...and will be again in 2005. We will ensure that with our own work right here in the Bay Area. I ask you to clear your day for June 15th so that you can express your views to be taken to the WHCOA in September, 2005.





# Volunteer **Appreciation Day**


