Californians Unaware of Gay Tax Break

From the Jan. 16, 2006
Tri-City Voice newspaper

"In the heart of Silicone Valley, Santa Clara is one of the wealthiest areas of the country with some of the nation's most highly educated people. But County Assessor Larry Stone says same-sex couples often don't realize the property tax benefits that the law provides.

Stone this week (January 7, 2006) began mailing out the property details under the

law to 2000 domestic partners registered in Santa Clara County. He also has updated the Assessor's Website where same-sex couple can get detailed information.

California began recognizing domestic partnerships in 1999. In 2001, the Legislature gave registered partners the right to make medical decisions for incapacitated partners, to sue for a partner's wrongful death and to adopt a

partner's child. The law was expanded last January, and this year, lesbian Senator Carole Migden (D-San Francisco) spearheaded legislation making land community property.

The revision takes effect January 1, 2006.

A registered domestic partner now will be excluded from reassessment when one partner is added or removed from property title, whether by deed or by death, provided that the property interest is conveyed to the registered Domestic Partner remaining on title.

'The change in the law will particularly benefit older couples on fixed incomes,' Stone said. Transfers prior to the January 1, 2006 effective date are not covered by the new law.

'Excluding registered Domestic Partners from property tax benefits available to married couples was unfair and I am pleased the legislature has finally corrected this deficiency. Domestic partners should not be taxed from their homes when one partner dies,' Stone said.

Beginning with the deeds recorded January 3, 2006, the Assessor's office will identify transfers between registered Domestic Partners by reviewing the Preliminary Change in Ownership Report (PCOR) that is typically filed with the Recorder's Office at the same time a deed is recorded.

PCOR is reviewed by the Assessor to determine whether or not the property transfer requires reappraisal to current market value for assessment purposes. Stone is urging domestic partners to fully complete the PCOR. To the extent that the Assessor can identify that the transfer was between registered Domestic Partners, it will be excluded from reassessment.

As will all new laws, contemplating transferring real property or a mobile home to contact their attorney or accountant prior to the transfer. Transferring an ownership interest may have unintended and potentially unwelcome financial and legal consequences, he said. That could be an issue if a couple breaks up. Under community property-law, the land could be split between both partners."

Editor's comment: This article references the San Mateo County Assessor. The law applies, however, to all of the residents of California. All registered Domestic Partners qualify for this benefit. Check with your county assessor to verify what you need to do next, if you haven't heard from them already.

For those of us who write grants to get money for Lavender Seniors' programs, it's not good, because we don't have much research to reflect the needs of our people. February Book Review

The Whole World Is Watching:Living In The Light of Matthew Shepard

By Romaine Patterson

Advocate Books - \$24.95

The memory of Matthew Shepard resurfaces from time to time as if to remind us that tragedy is an ongoing part of life. Romaine Patterson has been a part of the Shepard legacy from the beginning. She was one of the crucial characters in the Laramie Project, the dramatic play staged by Moises Kaufman on Broadway. She was a close friend of Shepard and tried to encourage him. She had three brothers, one of whom was HIV+. She grew up as a tom boy and fought hard for her identity.

Judy Shepard, Matt's mother, pleaded with Romaine to portray him as a flawed human being and not a glorious martyr. He smoked pot and tended to be a spoiled rich kid. He put too much trust in people and was too free with his money. When Matt

came to Wyoming, he was on his own for the first time.

aftermath of Matt's death. She helped organize the funeral and resulting rally. She learned how to handle the demands of the media when they commandeered her living room. But her shining moment came when Rev Fred Phelps swept into town with his hate signs and words of venom. She designed huge cloth angels' wings that completely blocked out Rev, Fred's band of protesters. At the funeral, Patterson delivered a memorable three-minute impassioned speech against intolerance. Thousands attended the funeral and loud speakers were used for the overflowing crowd.

Romaine went on to do public relations work with the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force. She was employed by GLAAD, the organization that attempts to enhance the public understanding of human rights issues.

<u>The Advocate</u> declared Romaine to be "one of the gay community's brightest activists."

Romaine Patterson provides the reader with an intimate view of what occurred at the tragedy of Matthew Shepard's death. Now is the time for the rest of us to join the struggle.


Homeward Bound Bringing Alameda County Library to you!

Lots of materials are available:


