#### 'Brokeback' Takes Top Film at Gay Awards

NEW YORK -- "Brokeback Mountain" lost out in the best-picture Oscar race, but the film, about the troubled love affair between two cowboys, has taken the top film prize from a leading gay organization that monitors the media. The Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation presented the award Monday at a ceremony recognizing mainstream media for "fair, accurate and

inclusive representations of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community," the group said in a statement.

"To end our `Brokeback' journey here tonight is like coming home," Ang Lee, the film's Oscar-winning director said in his acceptance speech. "The fact is this: that `Brokeback Mountain' has helped to change the world. And it is such a privilege and honor to have joined you, and all the people all over the world, who struggle for compassion and equality." "Brokeback

#### Responses to 2005 Questionnaire

First, we would like to thank all of you who responded to our annual Anonymous Questionnaire that was sent to you in the newsletter earlier this year. It is important for us to hear from you about your experiences with Lavender Seniors. It is also helpful for us to learn more about who you are as an aging LGBT elder, because there is so little information out there about us. We added some extra questions in this year's survey to gather some additional information about you.

I would like to share some of the findings of the survey with you. About our services:

- 94% of you said that participating in Lavender Seniors helps you to enjoy life as an LGBT senior (some of our non-LGBT allies completed the survey)
- 75%, that you made new friends and / or connected with old ones
- 65% of you are "out" to everyone; 35% are not out to everyone
- 49% of you are lesbian, 44%, gay, 4%, bisexual, 3% heterosexual (our allies). Sadly, none of our transgender members responded.
- 54% of you are age 65 or under; 31%, age 66 to 75; 13%, over age 75
- 38% of you have monthly incomes or \$1500 or less; 34%, incomes between \$1501 and \$3000 per month; and 28%, more than \$3000 per month.

Our most important services to you are the gatherings, the reaching out, and the informative newsletter. The top three concerns you have as an aging LGBT person were concerns about your health, a need for social support, and concerns that LGBT-friendly housing and long-term care might not be available when you need it.

The major benefits of Lavender Seniors for you were the social support, the information and Friendly Visiting.

You offered the following ideas to improve or expand Lavender Seniors: more activities; more phone visitors; activities to promote our strength and balance; identifying LGBT-friendly care givers and housing; speakers on political issues of concern to LGBT seniors; informing the wider community that LGBT seniors live among us all; becoming more active with our local and county governments; emergency preparedness; and transportation to events.

#### Drug Industry Works to Impede Marketing of Generic Drugs

From Alliance for Retired Americans weekly Alert (May):

The brand-name drug industry is fighting in Congress, state legislatures, and courtrooms across the country make the process of bringing generic drugs to market more difficult. As a result, discount drug makers may not be able to sell many drugs commonly used by seniors in cheaper generic versions as soon as the drugs' brand name patents expire, the organization that represents pharmacy benefit managers warned this week. "There's an agenda to prevent generics from getting to the market as soon as they could," said Mark Merritt, president of the Pharmaceutical Care Management Association in The Washington Post. With several top-selling drugs scheduled to go off patent within five years, the organization reported, "branded drug companies are creating roadblocks to possible savings of \$23 billion to seniors and the Medicare system." Together, the cholesterol drugs Zocor and Pravachol, the anti-depressant Zoloft and the prostate medication Proscar would save Medicare \$13 billion if generic competitors come on the market as scheduled. After discovery of a new drug, drug makers currently have the legal right for 20 years to sell it exclusively. Slightly more than 53 percent of all U.S. prescriptions are filled with generics. "There is no need to give brand-name drug makers more than twenty years of exclusive rights," said Ruben Burks, Secretary-Treasurer of the Alliance. "Twenty is more than enough."



# June Book Review

#### Gay Marriage, Real Life

By Michelle Bates Deakin Skinner House Books-Paperback, \$14.00

The controversy over same sex marriage continues to embroil the public attention as politicians shamelessly exploit the issue to distract us from other pressing issues. Books and articles continue to spill much ink as every possible angle is explored.

Two more titles have joined the tumultuous shouting and agitation.

Michelle Deakin, has written for a number of publications, including the **Boston Globe, UU World, Inc. Magazine,** and **Boston Magazine**.

Deakin has taken ten gay and lesbian couples and encouraged them to relate their own deeply personal experiences.

Anne and Heather, an Oklahoma couple have thrown themselves squarely into the fray by allowing themselves to be used as a test case in the courts. Their parents have gradually adjusted to their unique situation, but they are even more worried about the possibility of the

state of Oklahoma taking their two girls away from them.

Gary and Rich have a twelve year old daughter and they are also embroiled in a court case in Massachusetts.

Perry and Richard live in North Carolina and failed in their attempt to obtain a marriage license. The belong to a church where the gay men in the black choir are out, but Richard's sister rejects any compromise. "I'm not comfortable with homosexuality because it's a sin. It trivializes my own marriage."

Jonathan and Dean have tied the knot three times: an Episcopal blessing, a brief ceremony at San Francisco City Hall and a lavish wedding at an Episcopal Church in San Jose. The reception lasted seven hours. They are awaiting a court ruling from Washington State.

Deakin has succeeded in putting a vivid human face on gay and lesbian people who struggle to make human liberation an everyday reality and not a vague abstraction.
