August Book Review

Man In The Middle

By John Amaechi; ESPN Books-\$24.95

Some of us in the gay community can identify with John Amaechi. We knew who we were in those challenging days of edgy adolescence--the nerds who were chosen last in P. E. class. Oddly enough, John, who went on to develop into a world class basketball player, was one of us for a time. He loathed any form of exercise and spent much time in the library with his nose in a book. But Mother Nature was on his side. He was quite tall even at age ten when he towered over his teachers. He was raised in working class England. John was the product of an inter-racial marriage. The father was from Nigeria, abusive and frequently absent.

He shot up to a height of six feet, eight inches. He received all A's and B's in school. John's life altered dramatically, when at age 17 he tried out for basketball. Unfortunately Britain is not a nation that is good breeding ground for basketball players. So John and his mother came to America, ending up in Chicago and then

moved to Ohio.

Amaecho points out, in his relaxed, informal style of prose, that "...life begins after basketball." Fame is fleeting; education must be the life goal.

College athletics is often a four year joke. Emphasis is placed on team practice and study time is merely tolerated as a necessary evil. After graduation many black super stars ended up working as janitors. They are no longer needed.

John did not always fit in with his team mates. "I read books, drank tea, and wrote poetry."

John was especially fond of Vanderbilt University in Tennessee. But the coaches harassed him for being too nice. They tried to toughen him up.

The ultimate goal for many successful folks is to give back to the community. This is where our hero found his most satisfying ambition--mentoring to disadvantaged youth. He centered his big brother program on six needy kids. John finally entered the NBA and played all over the USA and Europe. In Manchester, England, he built the Amaechi Basketball Center and backed it with \$500,000 of his own money. He is now retired from the glittering world of professional basketball and doesn't seem to miss the sport. He now lives in Orlando, Florida with two black boys who have moved in with him.

Life has been warm and good for John Amaechi. At 36 he is content but without a life partner. He is working toward a Masters Degree in Counseling. There is a high price to pay for fame and glory but John has managed to beat the system.
