Book Review

House Medicare Advantage Vote

On Wednesday night, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 3162, "The Children's Health and Medicare Act of 2007," by a 225-204 vote. The legislation expands the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP), a federal program for the children of the working poor, while helping older Americans. It would expand coverage for preventive health screening for seniors under Medicare and would provide \$19 billion over five years to prevent scheduled cuts to

physician reimbursements under Medicare. To pay for itself, the bill would raise the federal tobacco tax by 45 cents a pack, while making federal payments to managed-care plans under Medicare equal to reimbursements for the federally managed Medicare program. The reductions in overpayments to Medicare Advantage will increase the solvency of the Medicare Trust Fund by three years. The U.S. Senate passed a more modest version of the SCHIP bill by a vote of 68-

Coyle, Executive Director of the Alliance. "However," he added, "President Bush has issued veto threats on the legislation. So there's still work in front of us."

September Book Review

American Fascists: The Christian Right And The War on America

By Chris Hedges

Free Press, \$25.00

We hear so much these days about the threat of fascism abroad, but a major concern emerges right in our own back yard. Christian fundamentalists possess a quiet vision--total control of every aspect of American life. This idea is based on **dominionism--**the absolute rule based on the theology of John Calvin and his religion of the 1500s.

Since the 1970's R. J. Rushdoony has developed the Institutes of Biblical Law which proposed the death penalty for homosexuality, adultery, astrology, incest, and juvenile delinquency.

Right wing promoters of today are embarrassed by the extremes of Rushdoony and then tend to sugar coat their current approaches to social problems. It is all done in the name of love. We are now enveloped in a new age of cynical attitudes. As Gore Vidal once remarked, "Whenever I hear the word

'love' I reach for my gun."

The evangelicals of today number about 70 million or 25 per cent of the American population. There are about 200,000 churches in this camp and one third believe they will be raptured into heaven.

But Chris Hedges, who holds a degree from Harvard Divinity School and was part of a **New York Times** team of reporters who investigated global terrorism, points to negative statistics streaming out of the so called Red States where we find higher rates of murder, illegitimacy, and teen births. In Blue states like Massachusetts we find lower rates of social pathology.

Thought the use of mass events such as "love bombing" or instant affection, a wide public is reached. The cult of masculinity is used by ministers like the late Jerry Falwell is part of the campaign ("Christ was a man with muscles"). Sexual ambiguity is deplored. Gays are hateful.

Billy Graham is now old hat. He is seen as weak and too gentle. Today, say the new breed of salvation seekers we must engage in power politics. Hedges warn us of the danger of these powerful new religionists and reminds us of how passive and accepting the Germans were of Hitler.

Next month we will explore another branch of the same tree when we turn our attention to James Dobson and his Focus on the Family organization
