Tell the Census Bureau

LBGT people must be counted!

The 2010 census is just around the corner — and it's just as much a piece of the equality puzzles for us, for our families, and for our future.

This spring, you and millions of other people across the country will likely receive a census survey in the mail.

And while the U.S. Census Bureau claims to seek an accurate picture of who we are as a nation, there isn't a single question that asks if you are lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender.

Being counted in the census isn't just a numbers game. The data is used by researchers, advocates and policy makers to develop social service programs and make critical policy decisions. And when the LGBT community isn't represented in the numbers, then we also aren't considered as these decisions are made; decisions that impact our health care, our economic stability — even our safety.

That's the bad news. But the good news is we can change this. Thanks in part to the efforts of Task Force supporters last year, the 2010 census will report same-sex marriages. So if we send the message loud and clear that it's just as critical that the census and other government surveys count LGBT individuals, we believe they'll listen.



Feb Book Review

When Gay People Get Married: What Happens. When Societies Legalize Same Sex Marriage?

By M V. Lee Badgett New York University Press-2009

Lee Badgett is a woman economist at the top of her game. She is Professor of Economics at the University of Massachusetts and has given us the ground breaking work, "Money, Myths and Change: The Economic Lives of Lesbians and Gay Men." Now she focuses her critical lens on gay couples in Holland and compares them with their counterpart in this country. Badgett spent a year as a visiting scholar in Amsterdam. Here we learn that 53,000 gay couples flourish, but only 8,000 have chosen to marry. In other European countries the same pattern emerges. Only in America have the lavender set ran hell bent for marital bliss. Sometimes an unexpected development such as purchasing a home or having a

child produces the urge to make it all legal.

Conservatives argue that low rates of gays marrying demonstrate that gays and lesbians don't really desire marriage. Only time can reveal the real trends. Among Dutch gays 9% raise children and one in 6 are registered as couples. In the U. S. one third of lesbians have children and one in five male couples have desired to embrace the patter of little feet.

Surveys revel that citizens of most European countries approve of pink unions. The Dutch and the Scandinavians show the highest approval rate.

In these countries gays share the same problems as everybody else. One in five lack health insurance.

Some gays oppose marriage. They fear that any unique lavender culture will gradually disappear. But Badgett points out that the need for socializing with your own kind will always be there.

The emergence of the new youth culture will have a profound effect. They give their blessing to gay unions by way of a 30 point spread in surveys. We must also remember that increasing numbers of straight folks chose not to marry as well.

Badgett has estimated that economic benefits to our marriages would cost the federal government one billion dollars per year and additional millions to the various state governments.

Homophobic critics continue to beat the drums of fear and uncertainty. But states where gay unions have

been approved appear to remain in tack.

Conservatives seem to be closing the barn door after the horses have fled.

Badgett concludes by proclaiming the future of getting hitched gay style seems bright. It just takes time, hard work and patience.
