Photovoice Coalition Takes Off!

Lavender Seniors started its "Photvoice" coalition to address LGBT elder awareness and education in South Alameda county senior centers. The group has started phase one of the project which involves interviewing consumers at San Leandro, Castro Valley, Hayward, Fremont, and Newark senior center consumers about there attitudes towards creating more welcoming environments for LGBT seniors. During the second phase of the project Lavender Seniors will deliver a series of trainings and technical assistance meetings to



the staff and volunteers of these centers. Training and technical assistance meetings provide senior centers instruction on how to use the correct terminology when referring to the LGBT community, how to create appropriate marketing and outreach materials, how to address discrimination should an issue arise, and how to create policies that

protect LGBT elder consumers and staff. Photovoice coalition members plan to share their personal stories at these trainings and with city officials. It is these personal stories that increase awareness of the need to create welcoming services for LGBTs. The coalition will work on the project throughout the first half of 2012 towards the final of goal of having a South Alameda County senior center recognize June as LGBT pride month each year. The coalition is drafting the resolution and presenting it to California Alliance for Retired Americans (CARA) for their support at their upcoming annual convention in October. Book Review

Adam's Gift: A Memoir Of A Pastor's Calling to Defy The Church's Persecution of Lesbians and Gays

In recent years the mainline Protestant denominations have been struggling with the issue of accepting members of the LGBT community into their fold. The there is the time consuming arguments over gay marriage and whether a gay pastor and his or her spouse can be accepted. The phony compromise was: you can be a couple but you must remain pure and nonsexual. Can you imagine demanding this of a straight couple?

Jimmy Creech, a Methodist pastor for many years, who is straight and happily married, first encountered the gay issue when he met a young man named Adam who feared rejection of his Methodist congregation if they knew of his orientation. From then on homophobia in the Methodist Church became his lifelong cause. Creech graduated from Duke University Divinity School and was ordained in 1970. He met Adam in

1984. That same year the General Conference of the church officially prohibited gay ministers. The United Methodist Gay Caucus was officially organized in 1975.

Jimmy Creech paid a heavy price for his pro-gay stance and was forced to undergo the ordeal of a church trial. He was finally forced out of the Methodist Church. No church would offer him a ministry. In 1996 the Reconciling Congregation program was launched where

lavender folks were warmly welcomed.

The Presbyterian Church has finally reversed its stance and now accepts gays, lesbians and transgenders into their community. All of this pious queering reminds me of my own experience in the mid-1970s. I had decided to leave the protective umbrella of Metropolitan Community Church and start a United Methodist Gay Caucus in Alameda County. I, along with a few devoted allies began visiting various congregations wearing signs that proclaimed our noble cause. We were not well received. Finally I joined the local Hayward Church. As a result a special meeting was called and I was supposed to debate one of the Methodist Bishops. The Bishop did not appear and I was confronted with some 60 furious Methodists, with Bibles in hand, who proceeded to fry me in their pious frying pan. It was a warm afternoon. Finally I returned to the warm embrace of MCC in the Castro. I remain there to this day.

The United Methodist Church is heavily dominated by Midwestern and Southern churches, and also churches from third world countries. They became known as the "Good News" part of the church.

Jimmy Creek has appeared at Glide Church and the San Francisco Metropolitan Community Church. He is now retired and has given us his passionately conceived memories of a mighty and unresolved struggle.-Frank

Monthly Wellness Recipe

Try this simple, quick and fresh pasta dish from *Cooking Light*: Penne with Asparagus, Spinach, and Bacon. Use whole grain pasta to bump up the fiber and toss in any veggies you have on hand. Serving size ~1 ½ cups pasta mixture and 1 tablespoon cheese and has ~363 calories, 10g fat, 50g carb, and 5g fiber.

Ingredients

Yields: 4 servings

- 8 ounces uncooked penne pasta
- 2 bacon slices
- 1/2 cup chopped sweet onion
- 2 ½ cups (1-inch) slices asparagus (~1 lb)
- 1 1/2 cups fat-free, low-sodium chicken broth
- 4 cups bagged baby spinach leaves
- 1/2 cup (2 ounces) shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Preparation:

Cook pasta. Cook bacon until crisp. Remove bacon from pan; crumble. Add onion to drippings in pan; sauté 1 minute. Add asparagus and broth to pan; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer 5 minutes or until asparagus is crisp-tender. Add pasta, spinach, 1/4 cup cheese, and pepper to pan; toss well. Sprinkle with remaining ½ cup cheese and bacon.


