NEW SERVICES...

Lavender Seniors is now sponsored by Bay Area Community Services (BACS) providing our program participants additional support. We can better able refer clients at risk to senior case managers who will provide in-home assessments of their social, environmental, daily living needs. Based from these assessments, case managers create customized care plans designed to promote health wellness and independence. BACS also provides day care centers in Fremont and Oakland. Meals on Wheels, a North County Senior Homeless program, and transportation services for those living in specific areas of the Fruitvale and the Diamond districts, as well as congregate meals at senior centers. (Cont'd from front page) It was interesting to note that staff and consumers had no idea about how LGBT older adults had to hide their identity to protect themselves from being shunned from family, friends, employers, and the community at large. Staff also had limited knowledge of how to properly reach LGBT seniors. The senior center manager commented on how touched she was by the personal stories and how much she was inspired to improve the centers outreach to LGBT seniors. Washington Post Finds Conservative Seniors Group 60 Plus" Less Than Honest The 60 Plus Association, a conservative seniors group, is spending \$3.5 million on television advertisements accusing five Democratic senators of voting to ration Medicare services. The ads feature musician Pat Boone. Historically, many critics have referred to "60 Plus" as a front group for the pharmaceutical industry. The group's targets are potentially vulnerable Democrats in states with large populations of senior citizens: Sens. Bill Nelson (Fla.), Jon Tester (Mont.), Claire McCaskill (Mo.), Debbie Stabenow (Mich.) and Sherrod Brown (Ohio). "The Washington Post refers to the ads as, 'More "Mediscare" Hooey, GOP Version,' and I agree wholeheartedly," said Barbara J. Easterling, President of the Alliance.


