BOOK REVIEW

"How To Be Gay" By David Halperin Harvard University Press

Do we really need instruction on our own life style? Apparently Professor Halperin thinks that we do. He is a Professor of History and Theory of Sexuality at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He led a class "How To Be Gay: Male Homosexuality and Initiation". There was tremendous pressure to cancel the class by the American Family Association. Some spokesmen in the lavender community felt the course was a waste of time. Halperin teaches that gay political victories prevent the community from realizing its full potential. Gay stereotypes are the real strength of the community. These range from "snobbery, melodrama, adoration of glamour, caricatures of women and obsession with mothers." Students in Halperins class were far more intrigued with lampooning straight critics. Reading of gay novels bored them to tears. They would rather lampoon "Desperate Housewives." "How To Be Gay" is highly stilted, academic, and down right dull. Dear reader, you can safely skip this one.-Frank Howell


