FRANK HOWELL'S BOOK REVIEW

It is only in recent years that the LGBT movement has been successful in winning at the ballot box. Republicans have usually been powerfully organized and well financed. Liberals have often been timid and weak when it comes to reaching out to allies. When Proposition 8 narrowly won in California gay critics observed that the campaign depended on straight allies to do the talking. Gays should have spoke out on their own behalf. Conservatives used the ballot box and emotion -laden media ads to frighten and confuse the public. In 1980 two disasters arrived that were made for each other: "Reaganism" and the AIDS epidemic. This gave raise to the Jerry Falwell's Moral Majority. But the real genius was Richard Viguerie and his direct mail operation. Millions of dollars were funneled into the public arena. Blacks felt left out of the movement. Civil rights were for white gays only. Lucky for use Corretta King spoke out for LGBT rights. Amy Stone is an Assistant **Professor of Sociology at the Trinity University at San** Antonio. She has given readers an informative and incisive look at how our community has fought the Republicans and are now on a winning streak.-Frank

Human Chain Effort: A Smashing Success in More than 50 U.S. Cities!

On July 2nd, the Alliance's Human Chains events, designed to stop the chained CPI cut to Social Security benefits, took place in more than 50 cities and included more than 2,800 participants. Alliance members raised awareness of the chained CPI to many people who had never heard of it and led an effort to send over 108,000 emails to members of Congress. Activists' voices were heard not only in the halls of Congress, but in towns and cities across the country. The idea for the Human Chain originated with the California Alliance, and the effort paid off, leading to more than 110 press hits nationally.
